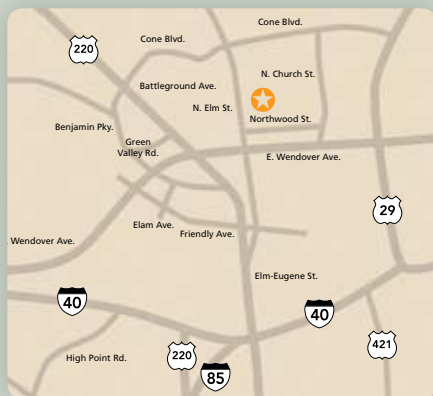

STROKE REHABILITATION SERVICES

Recovering from a stroke is an ongoing process, and rehabilitation plays an important role for many stroke survivors and their families. The caring staff at the Moses Cone Health System Inpatient Rehabilitation Center has provided stroke rehabilitation services to help patients and families return to full, productive lives for more than 20 years.

The Inpatient Rehabilitation Center, located at The Moses H. Cone Memorial Hospital provides a specialized stroke rehabilitation program as well as access to sophisticated critical care. The Stroke Rehabilitation Program at the Inpatient Rehabilitation Center is staffed by an experienced and dedicated team of physicians and rehabilitation professionals who provide personalized, comprehensive and fully integrated care.

Moses Cone Health System maintains accreditation from The Joint Commission. In addition, the Inpatient Rehabilitation Center is accredited by CARF, the Commission on Accreditation for Rehabilitation Facilities for comprehensive inpatient rehabilitation for adolescents and adults, and for specialty programs in stroke and brain injury rehabilitation. The Inpatient Rehabilitation Center is part of a continuum of care that includes a network of outpatient rehabilitation centers and a variety of community support groups.



The Stroke Rehabilitation Program offers an intensive, individualized approach to help patients regain as much independence as possible, with the goal of returning to home and the community. The specialized stroke team develops treatment plans that focus on increasing cognitive and communication skills, building strength and endurance, improving mobility and self-care skills and managing health. Based on individual needs, patients receive rehabilitation nursing and therapy services in an environment that supports recovery and ensures safety. Counseling services help patients and families cope with the changes in abilities and lifestyle caused by stroke.

The patient, family members and caregivers are the center of the rehabilitation treatment team and guide treatment planning. Families and caregivers are encouraged to participate in all aspects of the rehabilitation program, including therapy sessions and education classes. The Center's "apartment" gives patients and families an opportunity to practice skills in a homelike setting. Community outings provide a chance to practice skills outside the hospital. Family conferences are scheduled as needed or upon request.



ADMISSION CRITERIA

To be admitted to the Moses Cone Health System Inpatient Rehabilitation Center, patients must meet the following criteria:

- Need close medical supervision by a physician with a specialty in rehabilitation.
- Be medically able to participate in rehabilitation activities.
- Require intensive rehabilitation services for problems in two or more of the following areas: self-care, mobility, cognition/communication.
- Need 24-hour rehabilitation nursing care, and require at least two of the following: physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy.
- Have the potential to participate in at least three hours of therapy per day, five days a week.
- Be likely to benefit significantly from the program within a reasonable period of time.
- Have an identified preliminary discharge plan.
- Be 13 years of age or older and require no pediatric medication doses or equipment.
- Be free from any major psychiatric or behavior disorder.

Our Stroke Rehabilitation Program offers a full range of specialized services including:

- Management by board-certified physicians who specialize in physical medicine and rehabilitation (physiatrists).
- Rehabilitation nursing.
- Physical, occupational and speech therapy services with a minimum of three hours of therapy per day, five days a week and modified therapy programming during the remainder of the week.
- Access to local support groups for patients and families.
- Animal-assisted therapy.
- Assistive technology assessment.
- Cognitive rehabilitation.
- Community outings for practice in a “real world” setting.
- Discharge planning to help with the transition to home or the next level of care.
- Home evaluations, when indicated, to check for problems or architectural barriers in the home environment.
- Neuropsychological services.
- Nurse case management for coordination of care.
- Nutrition management.
- Pastoral care services.
- Patient and family education.
- Social work services.
- Therapeutic recreation services.



DISCHARGE FROM THE PROGRAM

The rehabilitation team works with patients and families to ensure a smooth transition at discharge. Discharge from the program is a planned event that occurs when patients achieve their rehabilitation goals. Discharge also may occur if a patient becomes too ill to participate in the program, is unable to progress toward goals or declines to participate in the program.
